The <u>primary health care provider</u> completes and **signs** the Care Plan with input from parents or guardians. It is implemented in the early care and education program. SOME or ALL of the following elements may be required in a care plan for a child with a special health care need.

13	Special skills training and education required and provided for the staff members who care for the child			
14	Signature of health care provider/date form signed			Always Required
